### 1. Difficult Rains 2015

According to some reports, 2015 has seen the worst rainfall patterns (few and oddly spaced) recorded in 80 years. Family Oelofse is preparing for another terribly dry season, Alex building a new barn for the alfalfa stock to be bought and transferred all the way from South Africa in the coming months. Two years ago Namibia had already seen a dry year, and in 2013 a total of 6 tons of alfalfa were loaded and distributed around our 80 000 acres to feed around 8 000 animals per day. In this context, we wish to **thank all our clients and supporters** – if it were not for you and the income you have helped us to generate, saving our animals in another dry season would have not financially been possible!

# 3. King of Beasts – documentary film on lion hunting and conservation

Producers/directors/cameramen Tomer Almagor & Nadav Harel visited Jan Oelofse Hunting Safaris in April 2015 to explore behind the scenes what hunting is truly about.

"The controversial and dramatic killing of a majestic 500 pound wildlion, is perceived by animal rights activists as an obscene crime, but our film unravels a complex reality where hunting plays a crucial role in wildlife conservation. With human population expanding exponentially, wild animals in Africa are constantly being pushed into isolated biological enclaves, where top predators such as lions grow ever more dependent on humans - photo tourists and trophy hunters. Through the perspective of a lion trophy hunter, the film explores humanity's views on nature in the 21st century, re-defining our notions of wilderness, in a geopolitical tale, where China, North America and Africa engage in cultural economic conflicts, encapsulated through the hunting of a lion, the king of the beasts."

establishment of the "AMY BELL SCHOLARSHIP FUND".


